...in some cases, towards an almost non-hierarchic settlement structure, readable in any order.



...many desired, as well as some ambiguous and problematic.

- + Cluster & productivity effects
- + Knowledge concentration
- + Wider economic benefits
- +/- Location costs / quality
- +/- Central city burdens (spillovers in favour of outsiders)
- Overloading of infrastructure
- Problematic environmental impact



Berne Agglomeration: Extension of road infrastructure for "bottle neck" elimination for traffic during peak hours


Agglomeration need a raison clêtre and vision for identity

EGERKINGEN Egerkingen Agglomeration Olten-Gäu: Vision for integrated development of business park connected to the village and landscape


... both in terms of their outwards relations as well as in terms of their unifying local structures

"Port Gäu" with connection to international waters and cities (outwards), "Lake Gäu" with settlement islands and industrial areas ("container ships") on their shores




... based on profiles, sustainability criteria and competition between agglomeration for to be effective


Swiss Agglomeration Programme:


 Financial support for agglomerations on their transport infrastructure by the federal government

Framework conditions:

- Coherent strategic planning of transport and settlement development
- Generations every 4 years
- Financial contribution to investment costs between 30-50% (depending on "effectiveness" and "competition")
